ARKANSAS EXHIBITORS NOTICE ARKANSAS STATE SHOW

Refer to the General Rules Package for eligibility requirements in the Arkansas State Show. The first four animals in each class shown by an eligible exhibitor will receive Arkansas State Show premiums irrespective of their standing in the Open Class. **ARKANSAS PREMIUMS WILL NOT BE PAID IN GROUP CLASSES.** These placing shall be recorded in the breed judging book.

Premiums shall be awarded as follows:

- \$20.00 for FIRST PLACE
- \$12.00 for SECOND PLACE
- \$8.00 for THIRD PLACE
- \$4.00 for FOURTH PLACE

SPECIAL AWARDS FOR OPEN DAIRY DIVISIONS

PRODUCTION PREMIUM: To acknowledge those cows that have superior producing ability as well as desirable type, premium money will be increased on a percentage basis according to the level of production based on actual yield for combined fat and protein. The schedule for increasing premiums is as follows:

- Over 1400 pounds.....20%
- 1201-1400 pounds15%
- 1000-1200 pounds10%

To qualify for these production premiums, the cow must have completed the lactation after July 1, 2009. Projected records will be accepted only in the two-year-old class. All records are to be DHI or DHIR calculated on a 305 – 2x – Actual basis. The DHI form 200, 203, or the lactation listing of the breed associations showing the record must be presented to the dairy superintendent at the time of checking the registration papers. The Breed Production Award winners will be announced at the end of their class. Notes of production percentages must be written in check in books of show during check in.

SPECIAL RULES

Dairy Cattle exhibitors will be allowed two free substitutions in the entire Dairy Show. (Not 2 within each breed.)

Breed Section that is published in this Livestock Handbook may have premiums withheld the following year in the event that fewer than ten head are shown or there are fewer than two exhibitors, at the discretion of the management.

An exhibitor and breeder is defined as follows: "Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family, residing on one farm, and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premier Exhibitor, Premier Breeder, Dairy Herd Daughter-Dam, Best Three Females, and Exhibitor's Herd."

Dairy Herd: Group to consist of four cows that have freshened. All are to be owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

Best Three Females: Any age, all are to have been bred and owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

Produce-of-Dam: Group to consist of two animals, any age, the produce of one cow. The dam must be named. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry from the same cow. Animals need not both be owned by one exhibitor.

Daughter-Dam: A cow and one offspring of any age. Animals may be owned by one or more exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry from each Dam.

Exhibitor's Herd: Three cows that have calved and two heifers any age.

Get of Sire: Four animals by one sire shown in the classes listed below.

NEW AWARD! Supreme Champion Female: A Supreme Dairy Cattle Champion Female will be named. The Grand Champion Female from each Dairy Cattle Show will compete for the title of Supreme Dairy Cattle Champion Female.

Premier Exhibitor's Award: The exhibitor winning the most points on — not to exceed eight animals owned and exhibited by himself in the open single classes shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. The scale of points will be the same as that for determining Premier Breeder.

Premier Breeder's Award: The breeder winning the most points on — not to exceed eight animals in the open single classes, exhibited by himself and/or other exhibitors — shall be designated the Premier Breeder. The point system for determining Premier Breeder is as follows:

In the event of a tie in the Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Contest the following policy will be applied: The exhibitor accumulating the most points within the Senior Female classes (excluding Dry Cows) will win the award.

SLEEPING / CAMPING IN LIVESTOCK BARN

- NO tarps or covered stalls are allowed in any Livestock Barn at any time.
- If you choose to sleep in the barn at night, you are not allowed to cover any stall or pen even at night. All bedding must be completely out of sight no later than 6 AM. Exhibit areas must be kept neat and clean at all times.
- NO microwaves, coffeepots, hotplates, televisions, slow cookers, etc. are allowed in the barns.
- Refrigerators will be allowed only if they are elevated at least 16 inches from the floor and platform must be cinder block or wood. DO NOT PLACE REFRIGERATORS ON A BALE OF STRAW OR HAY. Any refrigerator deemed unsafe by ASF Management will be removed from barn immediately. All items are subject to inspection by the Little Rock Fire Marshall, Arkansas Health Department, ASF Management, ASF Security, and the ASF Insurance Carrier.
