Special Awards

- **JUNIOR ANGUS SHOW:** THE AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for Junior Angus heifers, bred and owned heifers, individual classes for Junior Angus bulls, bred and owned bulls, cow/calf pairs and registered Angus steers as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The Association contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the show. See breed specific sanctioning guidelines listed specifically for Junior Angus show.
- **JUNIOR SHORTHORN SHOW:** THE ARKANSAS SHORTHORN ASSOCIATION will provide the Richard Yarnell Memorial Herdsman Award to an outstanding junior showman and herdsman.
- **JUNIOR SHORTHORN SHOW:** THE ARKANSAS SHORTHORN ASSOCIATION will provide an official ASF Belt Buckle to the Grand Champion Shorthorn Female and the Grand Champion Shorthorn Bull winners.
- **JUNIOR BRANGUS SHOW:** THE ARKANSAS BRANGUS BREEDERS ASSOCIATION will provide an official ASF Belt Buckle to the Grand Champion Junior Brangus Heifer and the Grand Champion Junior Brangus Bull winners.
- **JUNIOR LIMOUSIN SHOW:** THE ARKANSAS LIMOUSIN ORGANIZATION will award a trophy to the Junior Exhibitor who has the Champion Bull and the Junior Exhibitor who has the Champion female and all class winners.
- **JUNIOR SANTA GERTRUDIS SHOW:** THE ARKOMA SANTA GERTRUDIS BREEDERS ASSOCIATION will award an official ASF Belt Buckle to the Grand Champion Female and Grand Champion Bull winners.
- **JUNIOR SIMMENTAL SHOW:** THE ARKANSAS JUNIOR SIMMENTAL ASSOCIATION will award an official ASF Belt Buckle to the winner of Grand Champion Simmental Female and the Grand Champion Simsolution Female.
- **JUNIOR SIMMENTAL SHOW:** WHITTMORE FARMS will award an official ASF Belt Buckle to the winner of Grand Champion Simmental Bull and the Grand Champion Simsolution Bull.
- **JUNIOR BRAHMAN SHOW:** THE ARKANSAS JUNIOR BRAHMAN ASSOCIATION will provide special awards for class winners, Grand Champions, and Reserve Grand Champions in the Junior Brahman Show.

SPECIAL RULES

JUNIOR BREEDING BEEF

GENERAL RULES: All General Rules and Regulations and Junior Department specific rules listed for Arkansas State Fair Livestock Competition apply. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to read and understand these Rules and Regulations. The following rules apply to Junior Shows held under the direction of ASF Management and the ALSA.

JUNIOR COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY:

FFA & 4-H MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS - All contestants in this show must be bona fide Arkansas 4-H Club members enrolled in projects they are exhibiting or FFA Members in the State of Arkansas for the current School year, as certified by their County Agent or Agricultural Education Advisor. Contestants are to be members in good standing and have received an overview of the ASF rules. A Junior Exhibitor Signature Form must be on file with the ASF Livestock Office for eligibility in any competition.

AGE REQUIREMENTS - This division is limited to Arkansas students only, who are bona fide members of an Arkansas FFA Chapter or 4-H Club in good standing. Only youth who are at least 9 years of age and have not reached their 20th birthday on or before the first day of the current year Arkansas State Fair (October 8, 2010) are eligible. Additionally, exhibitors may exhibit in this show no later than the fall after graduating from high school or having received a GED certificate or its equivalent, regardless of age. Read Junior Exhibitor Rules for more specific information on Junior Competitions.

REGISTRATION PAPERS & OWNERSHIP: Exhibitors must own their own animals, must have acquired title and taken possession of it at the beginning of and throughout the feeding and fitting period. This feeding and fitting period begins July 15 and ends at the conclusion of the Arkansas State Fair unless otherwise stated in an individual department. Animal must be registered solely in the individual's name (Junior Exhibitor). To be considered a complete registration – the Date of Sale must reflect a date of July 15 or prior. No co-ownerships, no Chapter Ownerships, no Club Ownerships, no Farm Names are allowed. Not even if the co-ownership is comprised of two family members or two Junior Exhibitors. If standard registration papers from your animal's breed association do not reflect a Date of Sale – the appropriate date on which to configure ownership will be determined by the Livestock Office. Please call the Livestock Office if your papers do not have a Date of Sale. Exhibitors must show original registration papers at check in or at any time requested by ASF Livestock Show Management. Exhibitors found in violation of ownership requirements will be subject to the penalties outlined in the ASF General Information and Rules. **Registration papers must specify exhibitor's full legal name, and may not be in a farm name or name other than the exhibitor from July 15 through the completion of the show. Copies of registration papers will not be accepted – ORIGINAL papers must be presented. Tattoos/Brands will be verified.**

NEW RULE! BREED SHOW REQUIREMENTS: A breed show must have a minimum of ten animals shown by at least two exhibitors in order to qualify for an official show. Any breed listed in the current premium list that has less than ten head will show in AOB the following year. If a breed in AOB has ten head or more shown by at least two exhibitors they will qualify for a breed show the following year.

CARE AND CUSTODY: All animals must remain in the continuous possession of the exhibitor and be personally cared for by the exhibitor during the duration of the project. ASF officials reserve the right to inspect ownership and request specific information regarding care and custody of an animal at any time during the duration of the project.

FITTING/GROOMING AND ANIMAL CARE: Fitting, grooming and care of all junior livestock entries is to be performed solely by the exhibitor whose name appears on the entry. Exhibitors may be assisted only by their immediate family (which includes Parents, Permanent Legal Guardians when documentation of guardianship is provided to ASF, siblings, aunts, uncles, and grandparents); the exhibitor's County Extension Agent and/or FFA Instructor and fellow exhibitors who have an entry in the ASF Junior Livestock Show. The exhibitor must be present at all times during fitting when assistance is being provided. At no time shall an exhibitor provide payment in any form to anyone assisting in the grooming of an animal. Painting of switches, tail heads, topknots, and boning of legs are permissible.

ANIMAL MOVEMENT & HOUSING: All animals are not to be moved from their assigned pen, stall or tie out space between the hours of 11 PM and 4 AM. Exhibitor access to animals during this time will be permitted. Animals must be on display in the barns during required times. Failure to comply will result in disqualification. Animals are not allowed to be housed inside livestock trailers except when being transported at appropriate time. At no time shall an animal enter a barn where different species are to be or are currently housed. For Example: Swine shall be limited to the swine barn and are not allowed in any other barn.

SHOWING ANIMALS: Exhibitors will be required to show their own animal. A substitute exhibitor may be allowed to present an animal in the show ring during official judging at the sole discretion of the Superintendent or other ASF Livestock Show management; 1) if the exhibitor has documented health reasons after arrival at the Fair, or 2) if an exhibitor has more than one entry in an ASF Junior Livestock Show showing at the same time. Approval must be obtained for a substitute showman prior to the start of the class in which there is a conflict. Any substitute exhibitor must be a bona fide member of Arkansas 4-H or FFA that has a current Junior Livestock entry at the ASF. In no case may a parent, agent or advisor present or assist with presentation of any animal for classification, sifting or judging. Any exceptions to this rule will be handled on a case by case basis.

PREMIUMS: Premiums offered by Breed Associations and Special Groups will be in addition to those premiums and awards listed by the Arkansas State Fair.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION & AGE: Tattoo numbers or brands of all breeding animals shown may be checked by a Livestock Office assistant or an official of the National or State Breed Association at any time. All animals entered in the breeding classes are subject to mouthing. Any animal found to be over age for its class will be banned from competition and the exhibitor may suffer penalties.

ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY: Exotic crosses such as Simmental, Limousin, Maine Anjou, etc., must be three-quarter blood or greater to be eligible to show with the exception of registered composite shows.

GROUP CLASS ENTRY: Exhibitors who are entering a group class or bred and owned class must indicate on entry each group class in which they expect to compete. Verify group entry registration at time of check in. Animals shown in group classes must have been entered and shown in individual classes. NO County Groups.

JUNIOR BEEF SHOWMANSHIP: Only exhibitors that have shown in the Junior Department are eligible. Exhibitor must own animal. ***State Fair Showmanship Contests are divided into two division: Junior (Ages 9 – 13) and Senior (Ages 14 and up). Base date for computing age is the exhibitor's age on the opening day of the current Arkansas State Fair (October 8, 2010).***

BREED SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITIONS: Breed showmanship contests are the responsibility of the Breed Association. State Fair judges will not be available to judge showmanship. Breed associations may select someone to judge showmanship while breed show is in progress OR at the end of the day after all judging is completed. Time will not be allowed during specific breed shows for showmanship competition.

NEW RULE! BRED & OWNED CLASSES: Exhibitor must be listed as breeder on registration papers for animals entered in this class. Calf must be entered in show. Entries will not be accepted at check in. Entries in group classes must be made at time of entry (either online or paper entry). Exhibitor must have been sole owner of dam at least 300 days prior to birth of calf entered in show and must present the dam's registration papers with exhibitor listed as the owner at check in.

JUNIOR ANGUS SHOW – SPECIAL INFORMATION

THE AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, MO. will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for Junior Angus heifers, bred and owned heifers, bred and owned bulls, cow/calf pairs and registered Angus Steers as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The Association contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the show.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the Junior Angus classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums.

Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

Only bred and owned bulls may be counted in the numbers report for premium participation.

To be eligible for Association premiums, the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the Junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.

The animals must be judged by the **American system of judging** (they must be placed numerically and the ribbons and premiums awarded in the same manner.) The American Angus Association does not offer financial assistance or awards on any show judged under the Danish or group system of judging.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show.

Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with calf at side, calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show date and have the original registration certificate at check in.

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

For an exhibitor to be eligible at shows for premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association, each exhibitor is subject to Part 3, Section IX of the Association's rules entitled "Eligibility Conformation and Structure of Animals Presented for Exhibition." Included in this is rule 11: "Effective July 1, 2004, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, and individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited." The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas."

DNA MARKER OR BLOOD TYPE FOR PARENTAGE VERIFICATION -- Under the Association Rules, each animal for which entry application (registration) is received, may be subjected to a DNA marker type or blood type test to verify ACCURACY OF PARENTAGE as covered under Association Rules. Staff of the American Angus Association must supervise the collection of DNA or blood samples. Animals are often sampled at shows, fairs, or events where the American Angus Association contributes premiums or where Association personnel participate.

If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of DNA or blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herd Book, and the registration certificate becomes null and void.
