SPECIAL RULES

All ASF General Rules and Regulations and Junior Show specific rules for ASF apply to this show as well. Read all rules and regulations prior to arriving at show including PROHIBITED ACTS found in the General Rules and Regulations. All exhibitors are required to read and abide by the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics.

All sheep entering the Arkansas State Fairgrounds must have a Scrapie Tag in place. Fair officials have the authority to inspect and order removal from the Fairgrounds any sheep showing signs of ringworm, wool fungus or any contagious diseases. Individuals in junior lamb classes must have lamb teeth and be born after September 1 of the previous year. Individuals in senior classes may have two permanent teeth not in wear.

Junior Sheep will be checked in on Thursday, October 7 from Noon until 2 PM. No copies of papers will be accepted at check in – original papers only. Animals must have registration papers at time of entry. Sheep must be registered in the Junior Exhibitor's name only no later than July 15. All breeding sheep must be registered in their respective associations according to the Junior Department Rules set by the Arkansas State Fair and wear the association ear tag. No co-ownerships, Chapter projects, Club projects, or partnerships are allowed.

Exhibitors must inform clerks of intent to enter group classes at time of check in. No animals will be allowed in group classes which have not been entered by completion of check in. Animals shown in group classes must also be shown in individual classes. No combination of breeders in filling group classes will be allowed.

There is no limit to the number of entries an exhibitor has in any one class. Exhibitors may not receive more than two (2) awards in any single class and not more than one (1) award in each group class per breed.

An exhibitor may not move more than one (1) Junior lamb to a Senior class. Only Senior animals with yearling teeth not in wear may be moved to the Yearling class.

All animals are not to be moved from their assigned pen, stall or tie out space between the hours of 11 PM and 4 AM. Exhibitor access to animals during this time will be permitted. Animals are to be on display inside the Barns or in designated areas. Animals are not allowed to be housed inside livestock trailers except when being transported at appropriate time. At no time shall an animal enter a barn where different species are to be or are currently housed. For Example: Swine shall be limited to the swine barn and are not allowed in any other barn. Junior Sheep will be housed in the Swine Barn. All grooming must be done in the Swine Barn and main aisles are to be kept clear.

Fitting, grooming and care of all junior livestock entries is to be performed solely by the exhibitor whose name appears on the entry. Exhibitors may be assisted only by their immediate family (which includes Parents, Permanent Legal Guardians when documentation of guardianship is provided to ASF, siblings, aunts, uncles, and grandparents); the exhibitor's County Extension Agent and/or FFA Instructor and fellow exhibitors who have an entry in the ASF Junior Livestock Show. The exhibitor must be present at all times during fitting when assistance is being provided. At no time shall an exhibitor provide payment in any form to anyone assisting in the grooming of an animal.

NO tarps or covered stalls are allowed in any Livestock Barn at any time. If you choose to sleep in the barn at night, you are not allowed to cover any stall or pen even at night. All bedding must be completely out of sight no later than 6 AM. Exhibit areas must be kept neat and clean at all times. NO microwaves, coffeepots, hotplates, televisions, slow cookers, etc. are allowed in the barns. Exhibitors are encouraged to utilize the Exhibitor Eating Areas provided by the Arkansas State Fair. Please refer to maps posted during Fair.

JUNIOR BREEDING SHEEP PREMIUM SCALE

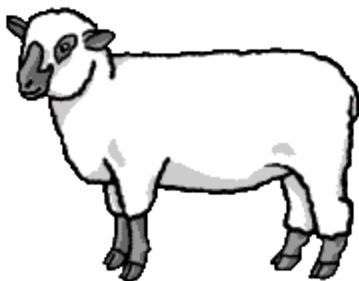

JUNIOR SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP

Showmanship will be held at the conclusion of the Junior Breeding Sheep Show.

Showmanship classes will be divided as follows:

JUNIOR — Ages 9-13

SENIOR — Ages 14 and up

Age division will be determined by the age of the exhibitor on the opening day of the State Fair (October 8, 2010). Showman must show his own animal in Showmanship. Showmanship will be judged at the end of the Junior Sheep Show on Friday, October 8. Ribbons will be awarded through 5th place.
