SKILL-A-THON GUIDELINES

ENTRY FEE: FREE

ENTRY DEADLINE: ON-SITE ENTRY ONLY

1. Competitions are open to individuals who have at least one approved livestock entry in the current year Arkansas State Fair.
2. Competition will be divided into two age divisions:
JUNIOR DIVISION: Ages 9 – 13 on the opening day of the current year Arkansas State Fair
SENIOR DIVISION: Ages 14 & up on the opening day of the current year Arkansas State Fair
3. Each Division (Junior & Senior) will consist of a system of questions relative to the Market Lamb Project. Curriculum materials and contact information is listed below. This contest is run under the direction of the Arkansas State Fair Livestock Department in conjunction with members of the ASF Skill-A-Thon Committee.
4. No pre-entry is available for this contest. On-site Entry only. Entry Fee is FREE! The Registration Desk will open approximately 9: 30 a.m. Each contestant will be given a scorecard which must be presented to Skill-A-Thon Officials to compete. It is the responsibility of the contestant to keep up with his or her scorecard. Contestants must remain in designated Contest Area until number is called. If special assistance is needed by the contestant, please notify Registration Desk at time of entry.

5. COMPETITION STRUCTURE:

JUNIOR DIVISION:	Five Stations	Five Questions each	25 pts. per Station
SENIOR DIVISION:	Five Stations	Five Questions each	25 pts. per Station

- Contest will be a 100 point contest. (Four Stations x 25 potential points = 100)
- Station 5 is a Timed - Tie Breaker Station. Score at this station will be used only in the event of a tie in total scores of Stations 1-4. The first Tie Breaker consideration is the contestant's SCORE at Station 5 - the second Tie Breaker consideration is the contestant's TIME at Station 5.
- A Skill-A-Thon Committee Member will serve as Moderator at each Station.
- Moderator will tabulate score at Station.
- Results will be announced and awards will be presented at conclusion of contest in the Equestrian Center. All scores will be posted after announcement of awards.
- Contest Stations will be available for open viewing after awards ceremony.
- Questions will be either right or wrong. No "judgment" made by Station Moderator.
CORRECT ANSWER = 5 POINTS INCORRECT ANSWER = 0 POINTS
- Contestants will be given a reasonable amount of time to complete each Station. Moderator will monitor and address excessive time at Station.

CURRICULUM DETAILS

1. The Ohio State University: Lamb Resource Handbook (Pub #194R 4-H) is the official Study Guide for this contest. Question topics will be derived from this publication. In order to accurately prepare for this Skill-A-Thon, potential contestants are encouraged to study every topic covered in this resource.
