Arkansas State Fair Poultry Handbook



Section 1: Broiler Show

Superintendent: Sara Orlowski

All Junior Broilers entering the fairgrounds become the property of the Arkansas State Fair and cannot be removed by the exhibitor from the fairgrounds.

The following rules apply to the Junior Broiler Show:

- A pen of three broilers constitutes an entry.
- Only one pen of broilers may be entered by each exhibitor.
- Broiler entries must be cared for by the exhibitor until the time of judging.
- Only birds provided through the County Extension Offices or Agricultural Education Chapters from the University of Arkansas Department of Poultry Science are eligible.
- Exhibitors must enter the state fair broiler show through Showorks entry system.
 Ordering a set of broilers DOES NOT constitute an entry into the ASF broiler show.

Section 2: Poultry Chain Show

- Exhibitors must enter the state fair Poultry Chain show through Showorks entry system. Participating in Arkansas Poultry Chain DOES NOT constitute an entry into the ASF commercial poultry show.
- Anyone participating in that program can enter the state fair. You do not have to win at county or district fair to enter.

Section 3: Poultry Show

Superintendent: Aaron Baker

The following rules will be enforced for both the Junior and Open Poultry Show.

NO Substitutions will be made on day of show. Entries will be judged as entered.

Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their own birds while on exhibition at the fair. Feed will be available if needed at the show.

One coop will be provided for each bird entered, including trios, when space allows. Double cooping of some birds will be available upon request when space is available.

All birds not claimed by 12:00 p.m., Sunday, October 22, will be removed at discretion of show management.

All judging will be conducted under the rules of the American Poultry Association. Birds will be judged by comparison method according to the American Standard of Perfection latest edition, Instructions to Judges, "For Economic Qualities of Standard -Bred Fowls."

The same bird can NOT be entered in both a single and a pen class. However, an individual bird from a trio may be considered for class or show champion. Exhibitors may enter more than two entries per class, but will only be paid premiums for their top two placing within that class. Shows will be APA/ABA sanctioned shows.

All poultry shall have originated from a US Pullorum clean flock (NPIP) or have had a negative Pullorum test within 90 days of entry. In the case that any bird exhibits signs of disease or sickness, the ASF Show Management has the right to remove the bird(s) from the premises.

Breed Show Requirements: All breeds recognized in the handbook for the current year fair will have a breed show at the state fair regardless of number of entries. Superintendent will review entry information each year and determine eligible breeds.

One coop will be provided for each bird entered. Double cooping of some birds will be available upon request when space is available.

All birds not claimed by 12:00 p.m., Sunday, October 22, will be removed at discretion of show management.

All judging will be conducted under the rules of the American Poultry Association. Birds will be judged by comparison method according to the American Standard of Perfection latest edition, Instructions to Judges, "For Economic Qualities of Standard -Bred Fowls." The show will be an APA sanctioned show.

Exhibitors may enter more than two entries per class, but will only be paid premiums for their top two placings within that class.

All poultry shall have originated from a US Pullorum clean flock (NPIP) or have had a negative Pullorum test within 90 days of entry. In the case that any bird exhibits signs of disease or sickness, the ASF Show Management has the right to remove the bird(s) from the premises.

Turkey entries from out of state exhibitors must also be accompanied by negative test results from an independent laboratory for Mycoplasma.
